Scoring Method: Excellent scores receive two points each. N/As also receive two points. Satisfactory scores receive one point each. Unsatisfactory scores do not receive points. Total each column. To determine the evaluation score, multiply all Excellent and N/A scores by two, and then add the number of Satisfactory scores. The resulting figure is the combined overall cattery score. The best possible score is 88 points. A score of 75 or higher is deemed EXCELLENT and will receive an "Outstanding Cattery" certificate, a score of 58-74 points is deemed PASSING and will receive a "Cattery of Merit" certificate. All scores below 58 points are deemed FAILING. Breeders should rectify their problem areas and may reapply for evaluation.

1.7	Contracts/sales agreements require all pet/companion kittens to be sterilized.

3.1	Spaces provided are appropriate for the cat's activity level, health and length of confinement.								
3.2	Enclosures are structurally sound, in good repair and free of hazards.								
3.3	The area is clean and free of debris.								
3.4	Any bedding provided clean.								
3.5	There are adequate sources of natural/artificial light.								
3.6	There is adequate fresh air intake.								
3.7	Temperature is suitable and capability for temperature control is evident, i.e., a/c and heat.								
3.8	Smoke detector(s) and fire extinguisher(s) are present.
